






# Response Times







# Domestic Violence

Police see rise in domestic violence calls amid coronavirus lockdown nationwide.

Isolation and financial stress can contribute to domestic violence, police and advocates say.

Reports of domestic violence increased in March in many cities around the country as the coronavirus pandemic spread, according to law enforcement officials — raising concerns about families' safety as they isolate at home.

Of the 22 law enforcement agencies across the United States that responded to NBC News' request for data on domestic violence calls, 18 departments said they had seen a rise in March. Houston police received about 300 more domestic violence calls in March than they did in February, a roughly 20 percent increase. Charlotte-Mecklenburg, North Carolina, police fielded 517 additional calls about domestic violence in March compared to the same month last year, an 18 percent jump, while Phoenix police received nearly 200 more calls, an increase of nearly 6 percent.

Cottonwood Heights has seen their Domestic Violence Calls jump from 29 in April 2019 to 54 in April 2020. This is a 53% jump in calls from last year.

# SAFETY MESSAGE

## Motorcycle Safety Awareness

### *May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month*

Motorcycle crashes involving another motor vehicle continue to account for nearly half of all motorcyclist fatalities in the United States. Motorcyclists are inherently at more risk than motor vehicles because they lack many of the same safety features of automobiles. From a statistical perspective, motorcyclists are 27 times more likely to die in a crash than other motorists. NHTSA has a vested interest in addressing the types of motorist behaviors that pose a risk to motorcyclists. In years past, and enshrined in statutory language, these efforts have been bundled under the moniker of ***Share The Road***.

Remember in Utah Motorcyclists can lane filter.

- Motorcyclists can move to the front of a traffic light on roads where the speed limit is 45 mph or less and has two or more adjacent traffic lanes in the same direction of travel.
- Motorcyclists can only move to the front when vehicles are stopped.
- Motorcyclists can't move more than 15 mph when filtering lanes.
